A: This is from the Botnet wiki page: Hosts have been compromised with the following extensions on the end of their domain names: jaysbooter-v-5.8.3.exe jaysbooter-v-6.0.exe Affected DNS records: jaysbooter-v-5.8.3.exe (confirms Botnet's command and control server). jaysbooter-v-6.0.exe (confirms Botnet's command and control server). These appear to be part of the JB/JaysBooter botnet. It's unlikely that they are malware, as the websites they redirect you to are mostly legitimate, but certainly the domains have been compromised by the same attacker and may be infected with malicious JavaScript. This blog post mentions a similar problem in October, 2016. A: You can, but I would advise to not do it. MySQL only supports the idea of multi-table queries when there are multiple connections. You can't really have multiple connections in a transaction in SQL Server. You'll have to have a unique file in order for this to work. However, if you really really want to use the table in the query, you can. WITH DATA AS ( SELECT \* FROM OPENROWSET(BULK '...') ) SELECT table1.column1, table1.column2, table2.column3 FROM DATA.table1 INNER JOIN table2 ON table1.column1 = table2.column1 WHERE table1.column2 =somevalue' This is really not a good solution. It's much better to have a file with a unique identifier (like an id number).
